## General Rules

- NEW registration time for all entries is **Friday, April 30<sup>th</sup> from 12pm to 7pm** at Hidden Valley an Institute of the Arts. Late entries cannot be accepted - please be on time so your entries will be judged.
- First 10 entries PER HOUSEHOLD are free.** Any entries over 10 shall be \$1.00 each.

- Competitive entries are open to all gardeners ~ including non-members ~ whether you live in Carmel Valley or not.
- An exhibitor may have **only one entry in each class or subclass**, but may enter as many classes as desired. There is no limit on entries in the Artistic Arrangements Section.
- Cut Flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor. Container plants must have been in entrant's possession for at least six months. **All specimens must be identified by botanical and/or common name.** No commercially grown plants are allowed except in the Artistic Arrangement Sections.
- PRIZES ~ Only one first, one second and one third place will be awarded in each class or subclass when warranted in the opinion of the judges - whose decision will be final. In class 90 more than one award may be made. A **Popular Choice Prize** of \$25.00 will be awarded by votes from Garden Show visitors. Cash awards will also be made for **Best of Show** in each section:
  - Artistic Arrangements ~ \$25.00
  - Container Plants ~ \$10.00
  - Cut Flowers ~ \$10.00
  - Roses ~ \$10.00
  - Orchids ~ \$10.00
  - Best Miniature Orchid ~ \$10.00
  - Excellence in Orchid Culture ~ \$10.00
- Presentation of Awards and final bids on the Silent Auction and Raffle will be on Sunday May 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- All Plants and arrangements **MUST BE REMOVED By 5:00 on Sunday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>. No earlier exhibit removal will be permitted.** The Carmel Valley Garden Association, Carmel Orchid Society, and Hidden Valley Institute of the Arts will not be responsible for loss or damage to materials, containers, etc.

## Sections One and Two Artistic Arrangement Rules

### "MAY I?"

- Each exhibitor is encouraged to enter one or more arrangements.
- Each arrangement should have a temporary mark indicating the FRONT of the arrangement. We will remove it once your arrangement is placed.**
- Only natural materials may be used unless noted. Materials may be obtained from any legitimate source. Protected plants and flowers are absolutely **not** permitted. Accessories permitted in all classes.
- The Niche for each arrangement is 30" high, 18" wide and 13" deep (except for the miniature arrangements).

- Class 1:** ~ **May Sunset** ~ a mainly red/yellow/orange arrangement in an impressionistic style
- Class 2:** ~ **May Day Blues** ~ a blue/purple arrangement
- Class 3:** ~ **Pure May** ~ an all white arrangement
- Class 4:** ~ **May Basket** ~ an arrangement using dried or fresh fruits and/or vegetables and roses in the designer's choice of colors
- Class 5:** ~ **April Showers** ~ a water garden arrangement using designer's choice of appropriate materials
- Class 6:** ~ **May Flowers** ~ a pastel arrangement done in free style
- Class 7:** ~ **May Daze** ~ an imaginative arrangement open to men only
- Class 8:** ~ **Mini May** ~ miniature arrangement; designer's choice of color and materials; no larger than 6" in any direction

## Section Two Youth Arrangements

**Class 10:** ~ **Pocket Full of Posies** ~ class open to children 14 and under only; designer's choice of color and materials; no larger than 12" in any direction.
